

As Cheryl would say: "Till our horseshoes ring on the pin again!" Stay safe! Ciao for now. SANTE




ABBOTSFORD HORSESHOE CLUB – DANNY COFFIN PRESIDENT


MESSAGE FROM THE STATISTICIAN – SAM TOMASEVIC







PRINCE GEORGE HORSESHOE CLUB – ALICE BOSCHMAN
