

Of course, I talk to myself. Sometimes I need expert advice.



What are the reasons we decided to move to Mexico? The degradation of Canadian Society, future tax increases, Mr Dressup, Spending like no tomorrow, silver spoon brat. High cost of living and Inflation, crime and murders. The crime in Canada is about marketing and selling drugs. We feel safer in Mexico than Canada, but to qualify that, we don't go to the bad areas, ie. bars after 9:00 P.M.

Third is the healthcare. In Canada Jim waited 10 days to get an appointment for a doctor then a further 4 months to get an ultrasound? In Mexico he walked into the hospital. in 15 minutes he was seeing a doctor and another 15 minutes he was getting an ultrasound, the procedure was much more detailed and through than Canada. It did cost us 65.00 and 35.00 though, and he got film x-rays.

Fourth is no snow and warmer weather. The biggest problem is, Jim had to put long pants on 3 mornings then bitches it's too hot later but generally it is between 65 -72 deg. F. They are totally metric here, I'm not. We picked the Lake Chapala area because of the moderate temperature, low humidity, no snakes, alligators and lack of insects. The coast gets Hurricanes, humidity (arthritis), a younger tourist base and therefor more tourist vendors. There is a higher concentration of Drugs and drug problems on the coasts. People getting shot, (drug wars).

Because there are predominately older expats inland, most goods and services are a lot cheaper than the coast, you do have to be careful wherever you are in Mexico. There are 4 bad spots for drugs, northeast and northwest borders with the U.S.A., the coasts where the younger tourist are, and the Drug cartels are fighting.

The <u>drawbacks of Mexico</u> are the cobblestone roads, they are narrow and one way, the sidewalks are terrible. The Mexican people are loud and fun loving. They have these "Cojetes" loud fire crackers during Oct – Dec (Festival season, weddings). The Spanish language barrier – minimal. My final advice to everyone is, **please don't come here, it is getting way to busy**.



First event was the very entertaining Poetry Slam – there's a lot of Undying love in the GVHPA















Next up was the Don't Break my Heart Event - players had to throw two shoes to score without breaking the heart...



Entries received with a postmark after May 17th shall be put on a waiting list and entered into the tournament only as space is available. All adults must have pitched in a minimum of two (4) US/Canadian sanctioned events in the twelve (12) months prior to May 17th, 2022, in the same division you are entering. Only one (1) event is required for Juniors. Exceptions for US Armed Forces members and family and foreign competitors (other than Canadians) are outlined in Rule 11, Sec D.1 of the RGS Book. Contact NHPA for more information regarding qualifying exceptions. All averages used will be the average on record in eShoe/ CANSTATS as of May 17th, 2021. Anyone qualifying under an exception must have those scores recorded by the same date. All NHPPA and any special tournament rules apply. Please see note regarding refunds. READ CAREFULLY: Any adult male pitching from the full distance platform may enter the OPEN MEN'S DIVISION regardless of age, just as any adult female may enter the OPEN WOMEN'S DIVISION. To enter the SENIOR DIVISION, you must be 60 years of age or older before the end of 2022. Any man that turns 70 years of age in 2022, is older than 70, or has an <u>approved medical exemption</u> may enter the ELDER MEN'S DIVISION. Entrants in the JUNIOR BOY and JUNIOR GIRL DIVISION must be 18 years old or less for the entire 2022 calendar year. CADET BOY AND CADET GIRL DIVISION entrants must be 12 years old or younger for the entire 2022 calender year.

Note # 1. 30ft Men with Medical Exemptions must be in eshoe as exempt to pitch in this division.

Note # 2. For class play, a minimum of 48 must enter this division or it will be canceled. All entrants will then pitch in the Open Preliminaries. Note #3 Junior Boys & Junior Girls divisions will be mixed for preliminary play. Cadet Boys & Cadet Girls divisions will be mixed for Preliminary play. For Championship play a min of 8 must enter this division or it will be canceled. The pitching schedule will be finalized by July 20th, 2022 and published on the NHPA website. If you indicated above to receive the schedule by mail, it will be mailed to the address you have listed above during the second week in June.

Please note: The NHPA reserves the right to disallow your participation for any of the following reasons; any errors on this form, if your records don't appear in eShoes or CanStats, any false or misleading information on this form, if the NHPA cannot verify through its established procedure the validity of any Medical Exemption, or for any other reason by majority vote of the NHPA Council. The NHPA also reserves the right to add qualified entrants and to make class participant changes after the deadline. No pitcher will be moved from class time or division, without notification, after final schedule has been published.
