If someone is having a birthday or anniversary drop me a line with the names and dates







I will miss you all. We will come back up here for the spring and summer, so I hope to be in some tournaments.










CENTRAL PARK HORSESHOE CLUB – ALLAN CUMMINGS



AL GUSHTA – KAMLOOPS

AL started playing horseshoes in the late 70s and joined the Kamloops Horseshoe Club in the early 80s (1980-1981).

I have played in over 20 Provincials, over 20 Western Classics, 7 to 8 Canadian Championships, and 2 World Championships.

Over the years my wife, Ann and I have travelled to many tournaments in the province and have met many fellow horseshoe players that have become great friends.

Some of the highlights from my horseshoe pitching are winning gold medals at Provincials in Men's D in 1995, Men's C in 2000 and Men's B in 2005 and 2007. Winning a silver medal in Men's A division in Winfield, and winning the Men's A at the BC International tournament in Abbotsford in 2008.



In 1994 I won a Canadian Championships in the Men's G division in Victoria, BC. I attended my second trip to the Canadians in 2012 in Saskatoon, SK and took first place in the Elders B division. I was 76 years old and playing pretty good horseshoes, throwing 52%



ringers. I had a terrific tournament and raised my horseshoe percentage to 56%.

Playing in the World Horseshoe Championships was another great highlight, travelling to Bismarck, North Dakota in 2000, and Red Deer Alberta in 2002. It has been amazing to play against and watch great horseshoe players from around the world.



I have had many enjoyable years being a member of the Kamloops Horseshoe Club. We have had as few as 2 members and have worked hard at promoting to build our membership. Today we have close to 14 active members. For the past few years it has been a pleasure to work with the Kamloops team to host the BC Provincials.

Playing Horseshoes has provided me the opportunity to travel, make wonderful friends, and to stay active playing a sport I have loved to play for over 40 years. My wife Anne, and my children, Debbie, Harold and Jamie, along with their spouses, and my grandchildren, Tiffany, Chelsea, Jordan and Erin, have all come to see me and support me in many tournaments that I travelled too.

Fellow Pitchers,


I hope everyone is staying healthy as we are hopefully moving in the right direction in the battle with Covid.


Had a membership meeting on March 16th, discussed agenda topics, main one being trying to sign up

Thanks for all your emails re shoes...I'm hoping to get back into the game this year...even if just pitching at practise time...sure missing the game...hugs Doreen/Bill



Once you start please finish that game and then you can stop and start up next game as long as games are completed by the deadline. I have a scoresheet that you can email me for this. We had success with lots of people from Canada and USA pitching in the Canada 20 series so let's have some fun and pitch some shoes. No entry fee and no prizes just bragging rights. APRIL 2021 SHOP (ON LINE) EVENT – MICHAEL BROWN

The April 2021 SHOP events, the April Thaw RR Sap Open (singles round robin) and the April Single-Double are taking entries. Both events will be from April 2 - 25 (4 weekends). Deadline to enter both events is 10 pm Eastern Monday April 1st. Games must be completed by 10 pm Eastern Sunday April 25th. Each event is a \$20 entry fee. If only entering one event, specify which one. Send your entry fee PayPal or Venmo to Karen Aley Graham at kbgra@aol.com, Steven Gibson at usina sg124sg@gmail.com or bank transfer for our Canadian friends to Tom Moffat at xpostiex@gmail.com. Use friends or family setting so that a fee is not taken out. The April Thaw RR Open will be singles using a round robin with at least 10 20-shoe games that are "Video Live" and taken a picture of your scores on SHOP Facebook Page. The player numbers will be draw after everyone has completed their play. Round robins will be posted after the groups are set up. The more that enter, the closer the averages will be in the groups. W-L-T (ties are 1/2 win) will be the determining factor for the finish in each group. Games tied after the 20 shoes will remain tied. Ties for all spots will be broken by total points first, total ringers second, who beat who if tied for wins, points and ringers. Entering average will be point averages using SHOP average or a converted e-Shoe average if the player has no SHOP average.

The April Single-Double will be the same format as previous events and you will have 4 weeks to complete your 10 20-shoe count-all games using NHPA rules and are "Video Live" and taken a picture of your scores on SHOP Facebook Page. Hi-Lo pairing for doubles. 4 events in one: Handicap Doubles, Scratch Doubles, Handicap Singles, Scratch Singles. Entering point average will be point average in SHOP events or a converted e-Shoe average if the player has no SHOP average or using 100 shoes qualifying. Handicap will be 95% of difference from 600 (6 * (100 – point average)). 1/7 cash in Handicap Doubles, 1/7 cash in Scratch Doubles, 1/7 cash in Handicap Singles and 1/10 cash in Scratch Singles. Both events are NHPA sanctioned and will count for e-Shoe averages and World Tournament entry. If you enter both events, you will need to pitch each event separately.

You must have a NHPA Card to play! To purchase, go to <u>horseshoepictching.com</u>, click on "e-Shoe" & follow the steps or go to your State Secretary to purchase the Card. All Games are NHPA Sanction and NHPA Rules Apply!

New Venue Locations for 2022 and 2023 World Tournaments



Changes have been made for the upcoming 2022 and 2023 World Horseshoe Tournaments. Due to the availability and change of venue locations for Lansing, Michigan, the Monroe, Louisiana Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB) has been more than happy to work with us and Lansing Michigan to accommodate those changes.

The new venue locations for the World Tournaments for 2022 and 2023 will be:

Monroe, LA – 2022 Lansing, MI – 2023

Responding to Questions about 2022/2023 Venue Changes

The NHPA Council, particularly myself have the memberships overall needs and finances in mind when soliciting cities to host the World Tournament. This also includes any amenities that these cities offer. With the Covid pandemic and the destruction it has caused for much business across the US along with the toll it has taken on everyone, including tourism and the hospitality industry, some cities are now beginning to charge daily rates for parking fees at venues and hotels.

Lansing is now one of these cities because of the economic impact that Covid has caused on the city. The City of Lansing has sold the venue that we originally planned to be in, and we had to revisit the possibility of canceling altogether or going back to the drawing board, which we did and came up with a solution.

In order for Lansing to host at all, we had to buy time to get this parking fee situation worked out. That is why we had to rotate the years for these two locations. We still will have to pay for parking in Lansing, but at a much reduced rate.

Please try to understand that the membership may not need to know all of the behind the scenes business details that we work on daily, but we do have the membership interest at heart and are working very hard to keep you and your families' financial needs in mind when we put these tournaments together.

The purpose is that these cities, for many reasons, are trying to keep their local taxes down, re-coop losses from the pandemic because no tourism in the cities, etc. As part of my job duties and responsibilities for the NHPA, I try my best to keep these costs down and negotiate for our membership because, as you know, many are retired on a fixed income, families on a budget for vacations, etc., and cannot afford to spend the extra money for parking fees.

Unfortunately, when going to these sports conferences to solicit cities to host a World Tournament (which this past year were cancelled due to the pandemic) cities will begin to charge for parking at hotels and venue locations. This "Free" parking that we have negotiated for, and have in our contract and have worked so very hard to avoid in the past, will no longer happen going forward. As always, as long as I have this job, I will continue to fight for anything I can get comped from these cities, but we also have to understand we may or may not get these things Free in the future.

Going forward, there is a strong possibility that parking fees will be mandatory at some of the facilities, and hotels. We as a membership need to understand this and plan accordingly. I truly do not think the membership would like to go back to having a "World Tournament" outside any more after having these nice large indoor venues with A/C with Hotels nearby or connected to the venues.

Please try to understand that the NHPA council are working for you and the entire membership and that we are trying our very best to take into consideration everyone's financial needs as well. This World Tournament experience should always be a memorable one for you and your family and not a financial burden.
