The Victoria Horseshoe is situated in a Municipal Park. We have a membership of 180 and offer organized handicap summer leagues for men, women and juniors. We have hosted the Canadian Championships four times and the B.C. Championships and B.C. International several times along with special tournaments to celebrate our milestones. Our facility consists of 28 pitching courts, 24 are covered for 40" pitchers and 10 are covered for both 30 and 40-foot pitchers. We have a storage shed for equipment and for special tournaments we acquire a large tent for recreational purpose as well as smaller covered areas with picnic tables. MOTIONS TO BE PRESENTED AT THE BCHA AGM

MOTION #1

Commencing with the AGM in 2010 the regional reps will be elected at the Annual General Meeting rather than at a meeting on the clubs within their regions.

REASON:

We are finding the some of the reps are not interested in the job to be done, do not pass information along to the members in their region. We feel that someone attending the annual general meeting will show the interest required for the position.

ELECTION OF REGIONAL REPS:

Vancouver Island (including Powell River) and Northern British Columbia on odd numbered years, the lower mainland and Interior/Kootneys on even numbered years. At this years' AGM reps for the Lower Mainland and Interior/Kootneys will be elected.

DUTIES OF THE REGIONAL REPS:

The four regional directors are to be assigned their duties by the President. They will act as liaisons between the Association and the clubs located in their region.

Motion made by Sam Tomasevic - seconded by Cheryl Degraaf.

MOTION #2

That the executive of the BCHA be paid for 3 nights accommodation (maximum \$80 per night) instead of the present 2 nights for executive meetings.

REASON

Often when attending an executive meeting or the BC Championships or BC International we work to set up the tournament, while we are not the richest people we feel that we should not have to pay an additional nights accommodation out of our pockets.

Example. This years BC Champs are being held in Prince George, for most of us to arrive on time on Friday and have everything prepared for the tournament and be ready to conduct the Annual General Meeting one would have to leave on a Thursday. That would entail having to find accommodation for Thursday, Friday and Saturday, or Friday, Saturday and Sunday if we leave on Friday morning.

We, your executive feel this is not asking for much from the membership.

TURNS AND FLIPS

When I started competing in horseshoes everyone threw a turn. I first played at work with three others and we all threw a turn and all threw over fifty percent using Diamond Double Ringers. I threw a three quarter turn and I think the others did the same. I later switched to a one and a quarter turn.

Later the flip shoe came into the picture. After a while more and more people started throwing a flip as most new players now do.

In my opinion the flip is a good throw at thirty feet because it lands softly but at forty feet a lot of ringers bounce off. It usually takes a lot of practice to throw an open shoe with a turn but once perfected it is far superior.

A new player can get ringers more quickly with a flip and that is why it has become so popular.

I encourage men throwing a flip to spend some time practicing a turn and that is usually a one and a quarter turn.

For quite a few years after I started competing and previously it was common to have eight or more men in the "A" class throwing over fifty percent.

Now we have very few men throwing fifty percent. Is that because so many are throwing a flip? I think it is. It is difficult to get up to fifty percent with a flip.

At the B.C. International this year there were five entries in the Men "A" class. The top percentage was just over thirty three percent. I would like to see more men throwing a turn. One of the juniors has just switched to a turn because he knows he will have a better percentage.

At Central Park we once had three juniors all throwing about sixty five percent. They all threw a one and a quarter turn.

No player has ever won the "A" class at the Canadian or Worlds Championships throwing a flip.

BCHA HALL OF FAME:

Fred Ormiston said that for this year the male player category had 3 nominations and that the nomination period was now over and the voting would be done shortly. The three nominated men are Matt Zablotny, Syd Lash and Lloyd Reyklin.

CANADIAN:

Sam Tomasevic was inducted into the hall of fame as promoter.

PRESIDENT REPORT – Sam Tomasevic:

Here we are well into the 2010 season. The weather has been anything but ideal.

The economy seems to be hurting us more this year than in the past. I looked over the tournament participation this year compared to those of 2009. Most tournaments with the exception of the Island, seem to be down an average of 10 players per tournament, now is it the weather, the economy or both. People are finding it harder to travel these days, money is tight. I also looked at the 3 clubs in the lower mainland, 2 of them are pretty much on par compared to the previous year. The club that seems to be hurting, which was a real surprise to me, is Cloverdale. They have held 2 tournaments and are down 8 players per event. Now this may have something to do with the fact the club holds Saturday tournaments while the other 2 clubs hold theirs on Sunday, or again it could be the economy.

Quesnel has held 2 tournaments and the numbers are down drastically.

I know one of the reasons for the decline in numbers is that we are getting older and not getting much in the way of new players who get involved with our sport. How to get them to join is another story and if I had the answers I sure would pass them along.

This years International is down 12-15 players compared to other years. Maybe because the Canadians are being held in Victoria and people can't afford both events is the reason.

Our website continues to be, as far as I am concerned one of the best out there. Results and lots of photos. I'm lacking photos from the North; if you live in the north email me those pictures.

I try to get the results and photos up shortly after I received them from the various clubs.

To all clubs, if you have a member who has moved to 30 feet or back to 40 feet please let me know when you send the results. If you don't tell me I won't know. It's hard to determine if someone is 30 footer or 40 footer in a mixed event.

I would like to spend a moment on our general conduct as executive members of the BCHA. Remember we are elected people and we are here to serve the membership. I have heard far too many complaints about attitudes this year. When you are asked a question answer it to your best possible way, if you are in doubt tell the individual that you will have to check with others and get back to them. Don't tell players your club has not paid membership dues and if they are not paid you will not be permitted to pay in any more tournaments. As a card holding member you're entitled to play, it is up to the BCHA to go after clubs to pay the dues. To the regional reps please ensure you care to each tournament you attend with application forms for such tournaments as the International, Worlds, Canadian and BC Champs. Do not think that someone from one of those clubs will bring them out for the members. I got a call from one club that was rather annoyed at me for not mailing them entry forms where available, they did not know for sure.

Maybe before the tournament start, the regional reps could make a little announcement that they have entry forms available. We can all do a better job of communication, and that includes me, this is not geared at one individual.

The newsletter as we know is now done via email and is also available on the BCHA website. We have gotten out one so far this year; regretfully have not had any time to do another one. Hopefully soon. To the Clubs, start sending in your articles so that we have something to write about.
