The 2019 edition is now in the history books, this marked the 49th edition of The BC International and the 31st edition of the Highwayman open.






Thanks to Washington State for the great turn-out, 8 players participants plus Ronda and Phyllis.





It's more than just the game of course, it's the people I've had the privilege of meeting, the exercise, and being able to give something to the community. I wish we had discovered this wonderful sport many


years ago. I plan on staying with the horseshoe family and pitching shoes for sometime yet.




