CANADA 55+ GAMES - KAMLOOPS BC - AUGUST 23-26 2022

Subject: Canada 55+ Games information

Good day everyone, this email is to give you information about the Canada 55+ Games scheduled for Aug 23 - 26, 2022 in Kamloops. I am sure most of you are eager to plan for these Games and have many questions. I will try to answer most of them in this email:

Qualification:

First priority to qualify will go to those who qualified for the 2020 Games. The reason is that no multi sport event has been held in BC since the 2019 Games which were the qualifying Games for 2020 and the 2022 55+ BC Games will not be held until after the Canada Games. This is also the case in other provinces except for those who are holding their provincial 55+ Games prior to the registration deadline for the Canada Games in August 2022.

However, everyone who is interested in participating is encouraged to register as there will be qualifiers from 2020 who, for one reason or another, will not be entering in 2022. There will also be some shifting due to movement upward in age groups.

Age Groups:

Everyone must register in the age group according to the age they will be in 2022. So for example if you were 59 in 2020 and registered in the 55+ age group, you would now register in the 60+ age group. Understandably there will be a certain amount of this shifting but from what I see in my records from 2020 there will be very few age groups which will be over the maximum. This is because each age group will have openings as people move up to the next group. And of course there will be openings in the 55+ age group where new registrants in that category can enter.

Partner and Team Replacements:

If you or your team qualified for 2020 and your partner or some team members will not be registering, you can replace them with a new partner or team members as long as those who were part of the original team are given first chance. Teams must be registered under the same name and have as many of the original players as possible. Remember when filling your team it is a BC team not a zone team, so you can find replacements outside of your zone as long as they are BC residents.

Rule Changes:

These are a few of the rule changes for 2022:

Badminton: addition of 60+ and 70+ categories for all events

Golf: addition of a 70+ age group in Low Gross

Pickleball: reduction of maximum entries to 1 pair for women & men in each age and skill category except mixed doubles which remains at 2 pair

Slo Pitch: will be mixed teams only, 55+ & 65+ categories with minimum of 10 players with 3 men & 3 women on each team (2 of each on the field at all times)

Swimming: 85+ category will now have unlimited number of participants

Tennis: addition of 60+ and 70+ categories for all events

Track & Field: number of participants in each event increased from 3 to 6 except for 85+ which is unlimited

<u>Registration:</u> will be open late December or early January. I will send another email once I know the confirmed date and the deadline.

<u>Team BC shirts:</u> will be available to purchase when you register. They are not mandatory, but highly recommended to promote team spirit and make our BC contingent easily recognizable. For our Team BC colours we are currently looking at navy blue golf shirts in a moisture wicking material with some white trim. They will be available in men's and women's sizes & styles.
