#### IN HOUSE CLUB FUN EVENTS

With the uncertainty of when we will be able to host tournaments, and not everyone wishing to participate with on-line tournaments, here is an idea **called IN HOUSE CLUB FUN EVENTS**, You must be a paid up member for 2021 to participate

This would allow your members to have a fun event and record win-loses, ringer, shoes pitched to arrive at your percentage for the day, just like you would if we where allowed regular tournaments.

I will email the clubs the last averages I have on hand as of JUNE 1 2020 to use.

Make classes up as you see necessary.

Games can be points, shoe limit, points and or shoe limits, handicap if you want

After your fun event, send the result to me to be forwarded to CANSTATS.

Till we have the okay to play regular tournaments, all clubs having a tournament on the 2021 schedule can run the in house club fun events.

This might get the members interested and keep them playing, you are now playing against an opponent.

What we would ask is **not** to invite members from other clubs, unless they are an associate member of your club, as that might cause issues with the government/municipal people.

Proper rules issued must be used, i.e. 6 feet apart, 2 players per court (use every second court). Sanitization available, number allowed for the gatherings as issued per your city or municipality.

We will leave it up to each club if they wish to hold an event, let me know as soon as you can, clubs not wishing to host an event I will put cancelled on the schedule.







In the Pacific National Exhibition, seven year old Louis (Tiger) Hoffard defeate*d* Annette Lavoy, Junior girl, with a 37 percent game. Great excitement surged through the crowd as little Louis ended his performance with a double ringer. Annette played very well, but could not come up to the young man's steady pitching.

David Hoffard (center) is 9 years old and turned in a wonderful exhibition of pitching. The tallest of the three is 11 year old Johnny Hoffard (left). He is the 1969 British Columbia champ and also the 1969 Bellingham Junior champion. At the Pacific Northwest Meet, Johnny defeated big Mel Campsall 30-27, hitting 60 percent ringers, in his



victory over the current British Columbia champion.

Another attraction was "Winnie' Winetrout of Lummi Island, Washington, 1969 Intermediate World Champion who hit 92 percent in his 30-3 victory over Stanley Pachota, Vancouver, B.C.

Jean Markle was a great asset to our Ontario organization. When things were going backwards she along with Merv Litchty dug down and brought it back up.

Jean and Merv Litchty were the ones who supported me and taught me the organizing end of it. I use Merv's handicap system in our league to this day.

In 1991 our Guelph Horseshoe club hosted our first Provincial championships and to this date we had the largest 2 entry's 1991, 197entry's and 1997, 167 entry's. I have being the main organizer at hosting

Provincial and various tournaments at our club since 1982 and 2017 Canadians and 2018 Doubles being the last.



I hold the President position since 2011.

In 1990 with the help of Merv Litchty we put my idea of a point system to host a skills competition and the top eight high averages, A class men's

players in Ontario were invited to participate. 5 events were played and our Legion sponsored it with \$500.00 prize fund. Each player would have a chance to win money in each event. We had a large crowd watching during this afternoon event. Andy Kutch was the winner with most points scored.

Event challenges' were

#1- Blind folded to try to pitch 2 ringers

#2- Pitch 2 shoes over a blanket and you can't see the peg

#3- using 2 shoes pitch a ringer in a 5 gallon steel pail set over the peg and filled with sand

#4- 3 pegs in a row from low to high in the pit and you had to ring each one, you had 2 shoe chance at each peg

#5- using 6 pits, each contestant would use 2 shoes and start on pit #1 throw down then move to pit #2 etc. and end up at pit 6. This was a race against time and ringers combined

1997 was my big year, Won the Prov. singles held at our club, Won the B1 class in Kitchener worlds with a 74.8 % 15-0 (entering avg was 69.3%) I was the only Canadian to qualify for the top 20 men's Championship class and finished in 11th place with a 75.9%. Following week we headed to St John New Brunswick and I won the Canadian Men's championships.

I am a 3 time hall of fame, Horseshoe Ontario, Horseshoe Canada & Guelph sports hall of fame.

April 30 is the date whether we are hosting the Canadians or if it will be cancelled due to this Covid 19. Keep up the good work Sam I enjoy your history articles.





# BC HORSESHOE ASSOCIATION COVID-19 RETURN TO PLAY GUIDELINES

February 08, 2021

Please note:

It is recommended that the following guidelines be adhered by all clubs in the Province of B.C., in order for clubs to remain in good standing with the B.C. HORSESHOE ASSOCIATION. It is understood that these guidelines are in <u>ADDITION</u> to whatever Provincial Health Officer and Municipal protocols are in place at the time.

These guidelines have been developed to assist horseshoe clubs in the province with the preparation of their individual plans for return to play.

#### METHOD OF PLAY

Style of Play:	Casual, Singles Play only
Use of Pits:	Every other pit only. There will be no side by side play at this time.
	Tools used for pit preparation prior to play and clean-up after play will be handled by one player only
Horseshoes:	No sharing of horseshoes. No touching your opponent's shoes.
Scorekeeping:	One player does the count and the other player keeps score
Etiquette	There will be no handshakes at the beginning or end of play

## SANITIZATION

Players:	<ul><li>Hand sanitizer will be on site and will be used by each individual prior to taking part in any activity on the horseshoe club site. The sanitizer will be used again upon completion of the activity.</li><li>Each player will provide his/her own mask/gloves should they decide to wear them.</li></ul>
Clubhouses/ Washrooms	Clubs who have clubhouses and/or washrooms facilities must adhere to Provincial/Municipal Health protocols for the safe operation of such facilities.
Club Equipment:	Brooms, benches, chairs, scoreboard, shovels, rakes, tables, etc. must be sanitized before use and sanitized again after use.
