Each week we get lots of entries from both Canada and the USA. #4 had 67 entries, #5 had 68 entries, #6 had 80 entries, and last week #7 had 82 entries. With the way they are coming in this week, we may make it to 100.

Every day I try to check emails and record

games on a spreadsheet. Then Sunday night usually don't get any scores after 9 pm pacific time so I start to put the classes together based on your avg ringer percentage in previous Canada 20


I then post results on Horseshoe Canada Online Pitching Facebook pages and then share to other horseshoe Facebook pages. And finally, I send an email to all that took place.





Some of our pitchers are playing in the Canada 20 email tournaments and others are showing an interest in joining too. We can't wait until we can all meet and compete again in person.














Good morning Sam.



VICTORIA HORSESHOE CLUB UP AND RUNNING - JUNE LAZENBY - FROM EMAIL 6-21-20



These are the commitments that the Victoria Horseshoe Club has made to their municipality in order to be open during COVID-19:

- · You must be a member in good standing to pitch.
- \cdot Everyone must sign a Participant Agreement the first time they come to the club after re-opening.
- · We will have a sign in and sign out sheet it is important to sign in and out every time you visit the club. The purpose of this is to assist with contact tracing should it be required.
- The pits will only be available from 9:00 AM to 9:00 PM.



- · The clubhouse will remain closed for the moment.
- · When an executive member is onsite, the shed will be open and the washroom will be available.
- · We have all seen the government briefings. The most important aspect of avoiding community virus transmission is distance so we must commit to adequate social distancing protocols while playing our sport. It may seem overly generous FOR NOW but we need to err on the side of caution for the municipality who gives us permission to be open, and for our own safety. We are blessed with having 28 pits so we will only be playing on every other pit. The

closed off pits are clearly marked so please do not use the pits that are designated for this purpose.





- · We have committed to drop in play and practice only FOR NOW. There will be no club-organized game play
- There will be only two players on a pit at one time FOR NOW. Each player will use their own shoes FOR NOW. It is a good idea to designate only one person to use the scoreboard.
- · Having only two people on each pit means a maximum of 28 people onsite FOR NOW. This is well under the 50-person maximum and gives us lots of social distance. The municipality really likes that FOR NOW.
- · Please be mindful at all times about social distancing, please wear masks FOR NOW.
- · There will be four hand sanitizing stations outdoors. Please use them regularly. We will survive the budget spike on hand sanitizer costs. Shoes, rakes, brooms, and scoreboard pegs must be sanitized before and after each use. There will also be sanitizing supplies in the washroom.
- · If you are feeling unwell, PLEASE STAY HOME.
- · The first aid kit and the AED are being moved to the shoe room in the shed. There is also a phone there in case of an emergency.

So FOR NOW, let's be grateful for the little things. We can pitch shoes, we can visit with our horseshoe family in small numbers, and we can be creative within these temporary boundaries to figure out new ways to enjoy our sport.

In my best Dr. Bonnie Henry voice - this is not forever, this is just for now. Few faces, big spaces. Please bend the curve, not the rules. These temporary restrictions are necessary because it is far more important to keep everyone safe so that we are still all together when we close the chapter on this pandemic. We look forward to getting back to tournaments and regular league play when it is safe to do so.
