Canadians at the 1956 world tournament, this picture was published in the SALT LAKE TRIBUNE Sunday July 22, 1956 and showed a record four Canadians that all Qualified for the 1956 world championship, L-R STAN DAHL (who can forget that Smile) VANCOUVER, TED BURROWS, PORT CREDIT, ONTARIO, HAROLD BACKMAN, TORONTO, ONTARIO AND DEAN MCLAUGHIN, OSHAWA, ONTARIO



From the years 1947-1962 STAN DAHL dominated horseshoes in BC, in that span he won 14 titles. His final championship was in 1965 with a percentage of 61.6%

Stan went to the world horseshoe tournament in:

1954 – Made the Championship class, finished 26th 68.4% 1956 – Made the Championship class, finished 31st 62.7% 1973 – Men's Intermediate Class 2nd 57.0%

Stan was also the first person in Canada to bowl a perfect game in 10 pin bowling and was very proud of the ring her wore. Stan was also inducted into the Hall Of Fame for bowling.

CANSTATS ISSUES – SAM TOMASEVIC



I have received many messages asking what has happened to my averages, I do not show up on CANSTATS.

REMEMBER HOW CANSTATS WORKS - Tournament results from all CHPA sanctioned tournaments are submitted to CANSTATS (national stats center) and entered into a common database from which pitchers "3-Hi" averages are calculated. Only the ringers and shoes recorded in a pitcher's 3 highest tournament averages from tournaments played in the last 12 months or last 10 tournaments, which ever comes first, are used to

calculate their official "3-Hi" average. That is done by dividing the total ringers pitched in the 3 tournaments by the total shoes pitched and the result multiplied by 100 and carried 2 places past the decimal. THIS SIMPLY MEANS ALL OF YOUR TOURNAMENTS ARE NOW MORE THAN A YEAR OLD.

Well well the Covid 2020 season has ended. That's league and playoffs. We were able to get a late start and were able to get in two six week round robins.



PENTICTON HORSESHOE CLUB – BRIAN RYDER





We did have one member participate in Sam's Online Singles Tournament.




with our club members socially and see that all our members were doing well.
