

ISLAND/POWELL RIVER (Lorraine Hubick): Victoria – Dropping in at the Victoria club house on June 26th, it was noticed that there was a ways to go to returning to normal after the heavy smoke damage of May 23rd. Hopefully all damage will be un-noticed by tournament day. Our next tournament is the Island Championships on July 16/17. Hope to see you there. In August, we have both the Victoria Open and the Saanich Open Aug 6/7. The Victoria Open was re-scheduled from May due to the fire. Our final tournament is the Autumn Mixed Classic on Sept 11th.
