PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Sorry I could not make our executive meeting, this is the first meeting I have ever missed as an executive member of the BCHA, and I hope I never have to miss another one. I have been having a number of health issues lately, one of the biggest concerns was why my body was not producing enough blood. I went to Eagle Ridge Hospital on March 1st to see a specialist to determine the problem. The next thing I know I am in the back of an ambulance headed for Royal Columbian Hospital to have an emergency operation. I was in the hospital from March 1-10, 2011. Slowly I am recovering, going to take a while but will be back to my old self, so watch out horseshoe world.

I would like to welcome two new executive members. Susan Macdonald is our new secretary, she replaces Jim Grant (who was elected at our 2010 AGM, but had to step down due to other commitments). Tom Moffat is our new regional rep. Island/Powell River. Tom replaces Derek Greveling who stepped down due to work commitments. Derek thanks for your hard work in the past years.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Dorothy Krimmer handed out financial reports as of Feb 28th, 2011. Bank balance is now \$1008.00 less, as 2 cheques have now gone through account. Dorothy also stated that all cheques must be made payable to BC Horseshoe Association, not BCHA. Dorothy Krimmer moved that the financial report be accepted as read, seconded by Marcel Pinette, all in favor.

2011 TOURNAMENT SCHEDULE: Sam has posted this year's schedule. Victoria will be hosting a non-sanctioned Charity Doubles tournament May 28th. Robin Degraaf suggested that SAT (saturday) SUN (sunday) also be included on the schedule along with the dates.

Letter was sent by Registered Mail on Jan 10, 2011 to the Comox Valley Horseshoe Club. Letter informed the club due to irregularities in the By Laws and complaints under the Society Act they will be suspended from BCHA unless they respond or appeal by March 5th, 2011. Comox Valley did neither. All in favor of a follow up letter to be sent to Comox Valley Horseshoe Club informing them that they are now suspended and no longer affiliated with BCHA. A separate letter will be sent to the Comox Valley members informing them of the decision and also to let them know that they may join another club or become a provincial member.

2012 BC CHAMPIONSHIPS: Island/Powell River is due to host in 2012 and will be given priority, but any club can bid for the Championships.

2012 BC INTERNATIONALS: Discussion about the Highwayman Pub possibly not being a sponsor for this combined event. Sam Tomasevic will talk to Abbotsford to see if they want to continue hosting the Internationals. If not, this topic would be tabled at the 2011 BCHA AGM to see if rotating between zones again would be an option.

CRESTS 2011/2012: Crests are ordered every two years for the BC Championships and the BC Internationals as well as the Lower Mainland Championships. Lower Mainland clubs split the bill between them to cover the cost of their crests. Cost of each crest is \$4.76 each (includes taxes) If any other clubs would like to be included in future crest orders please send information to Cheryl Degraaf (how many, what you want printed on crest, and a cheque to cover the costs).

BCHA RAFFLE: Make sure raffle tickets get our early to the regional reps for distribution. Suggested having a cut-off date for ticket sales at the clubs to ensure all tickets are returned in time for the draws at the Provincials, but raffle tickets would still be sold at the host club right up to the time of the draw. Also, all unsold tickets need to be returned to BCHA.

LICENSING/INSURANCE: The insurance that BCHA carries, Government Mandated, covers all clubs affiliated with the BC Horseshoe Association. Questions have arisen regarding who is actually covered, mainly does it cover all the volunteers in the kitchen or on the grounds even though they are not registered horseshoe members. Wording under Sports-Can says additional insured must be registered with the association. As this statement is confusing, Dorothy Krimmer will have wording clarified. Also, additional insured may be covered under Municipal/City or wherever courts are actually located.

BCHA has licensing for their raffle tickets, raffle tables and 50/50 at a cost of \$50 for the year. Dorothy Krimmer suggested all clubs obtain a "B" License to cover their fund raising as outlined by the Gaming Commission. Executive suggested Dorothy look into re-wording the BCHA application for a "B" License to see if all Clubs under the BCHA umbrella could be covered under one license.

REGIONAL REP REPORTS:

NORTHERN: Marcel Pinette – We had a good Provincial in Prince George. The host club added \$1500 to the prize money. We had a bad winter. Myrtle Marsh, a member for many years passed away Nov 2010. Dave Dunlop's daughter passed away December 2010. Leona Mckinlay, Joyce Hamel's mom, passed away December 2010. Madilaine Ollinberger, Jeanette Ferrara's mom, passed away September 2010. Many of the members spent the fall and winter at the hospital, so the Quesnel Horseshoe Club did not hold their fall meeting, and have postponed until the spring.

INTERIOR/KOOTENAYS: John Hamler – I will not be able to attend the meeting tomorrow in Cloverdale. My work demands will not allow me to get away, and I am still recovering from a severe abdominal strain. I contacted all the clubs in my area and only had input from Salmon Arm, as follows: with the deep snow and unheated clubhouse, the Salmon Arm Club has been inactive for the winter. Advertising for spring has started. Some members bowl or curl for the winter, while several go away to warm spots. So far there has been no funerals or serious illness this winter. We are

pleased to hear John Thornton has improved. Our new president, Doug Winslow will soon return and more activities will be planned.
